MISSION STATEMENT



63RD District Court

- Civil suits involving \$25,000 or less;
- Adult criminal misdemeanor offenses punishable by up to one year's imprisonment;
- Civil infractions; Traffic violations; Landlord/tenant disputes; Small claims (involving \$6,500 or less); and Land Contract forfeitures.
- Issue arrest and search warrants,
- set bail and accept bond,
- conduct misdemeanor and felony arraignments,
- preside over preliminary examinations for felony offenses,
- perform civil marriage ceremonies.



Highest number of new case filings per judge of all Kent County district courts




Effective and Efficient Clearance Rate






CRIMINAL MISDEMEANOR CASES








Probation

Provide supervision to misdemeanor probationers in order to monitor their compliance with court orders, including the effective collection of fines, costs and assessments.

Probation Division: Provide a **safe and informed** community through **reduced offender recidivism**, and fair enforcement of court orders.

This year, 73% of probationers have successfully completed probation


Percentage of All Probationers Discharged Successfully (vs. Unsuccessful)



Focus on Sobriety


63rd District Court probation department has consistently met its goal of successfully discharging 75% of OWI probationers





63rd District Recovery Court

- Planning Grant 2021
- Operational Grant(s)
- Currently 26 active participants
- Mission Statement: The mission of Recovery Court is to provide a treatment focused approach to traditional criminal justice case processing. This evidence-based program provides an individualized treatment plan and sanctions to encourage compliance and accountability. This results in a reduction of addictive and criminal behaviors allowing participants to sustain a healthy lifestyle.



Victim Impact Panel

- 90-minute educational seminar that is divided into two sections,
- Generally required of all drunk driving offenders. The first section utilizes technology and hands-on experiences to teach offenders about the impacts of alcohol on the body and the dangers associated with drunk driving. The second section connects local victims and offenders of drunk driving crashes, allowing them to tell their story and craft an emotional connection with the offenders.
- In 2021, 70 defendants participated
- In 2022, 215 defendants participated.
- In 2022, we brought the Victim Impact Panel to two local High Schools. Between the two schools we spoke to approximately 1000 students.
- As of 8/09/23, 244 defendants have participated in our panels for 2023.

Automatic Set Aside

- Effective April 2023 –
- Any number of 92 or less day misdemeanor convictions (disorderly conduct)
- Up to 4, 93 or more day misdemeanor convictions
- Up to 2, felony convictions
- Misdemeanor after 7 years
- Felony after 10 years
- Court shall notify arresting agencies of all 92 less misdemeanors that are automatically set aside
- Court must identify and manually set aside 93 more misdemeanors that predate CMS or MSP mismatched

Legislation for 3rd Judge

- House Bill 4920: Add additional Judgeship to 63rd
 District Court
- Chief Judge Jeffrey O'Hara testified at hearing before the House Judiciary on September 6
- Significantly high case rates per judge
 - 63rd District Judges: 13,271
 - All other Kent County District Court Judges: 7,793
- 63rd Jurisdiction growth of 11.2%
- Specialized Docket growth
