Spending Time with the Children

Weekly Parenting Time

Weekend parenting time is defined as time spent with a parent beginning Friday evening and ending Sunday evening.

Holiday Parenting Time

The following are recognized holidays: Memorial Day, Labor Day, 4th of July, Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, and Easter. Specify any other holiday that you observe:

Holiday parenting time is defined as time spent with a parent on the day of the holiday.

Each parent's holiday parenting time should be:

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School Vacation Parenting Time

School vacation parenting time is defined as any time there is planned time off from school other than weekends, such as: Christmas break, winter break, conference breaks, teacher conference days, spring break, Easter break, and summer break. School vacation parenting time begins the day school recesses and ends the day before school is scheduled to resume.
