GIVE YOUR OLD TV NEW LIFE...RECYCLE IT!

(Grand Rapids, MI) – Breathe new life into your old analog TV by recycling it when you're done with it.

With less than 70 days before the end of analog TV signals, the Kent County Department of Public Works encourages you to recycle your old TV if a new one is in your plans this holiday season.

Televisions, along with other small electronics, can be dropped off for free recycling at three of Kent County's disposal facilities.

- Kent County Recycling Center, 322 Bartlett Street SW, Grand Rapids
- South Kent Landfill, 300 100th Street, Byron Center
- North Kent Transfer Station, 2908 Ten Mile Road, Rockford

The televisions will be transported to local electronics recycler Valley City Environmental Services to be refurbished or disassembled for recycling.
