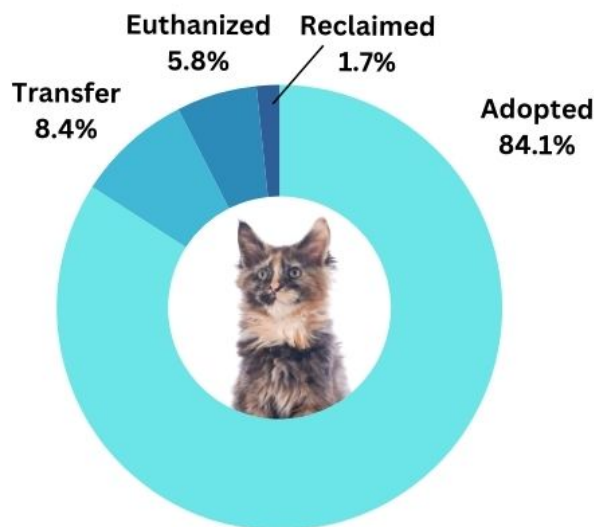

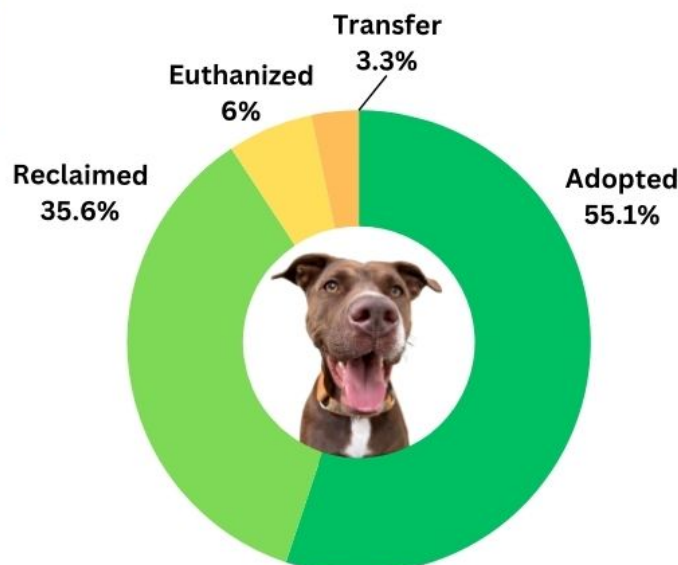

KCAS provides euthanasia services for pet owners. In 2023, families of 180 dogs chose KCAS for their own pet's euthanasia. Those figures are not included in shelter intake/outcomes as they are a paid service.

Euthanasia is only performed when ill or injured animals cannot be kept comfortable and stable; or who have a contagious, life-threatening illness, in addition to animals who are a danger to public safety. Kent County Animal Shelter does not euthanize animals for length of stay at the shelter.
