Mission

To protect the rights, safety, and security of Kent County residents through diligent efforts to prosecute criminal offenses in Kent County.

Overview

The Prosecuting Attorney appears for the State or County in all criminal prosecutions in Circuit Court and District Court, as well as appearances in delinquency, neglect, mental incompetency, and adult guardianship proceedings in both Probate

Court and the Family Division of the Circuit Court. The Prosecuting Attorney shares jurisdiction with the Michigan Attorney General for any crime that is committed in Kent County, but is independent of that State office. The Prosecuting Attorney is an elected official with a four-year term, chosen at the time of the Presidential election, on the partisan ballot.

The office is divided into the following divisions: Criminal, Appellate, Family Law and Juvenile. Each division has specific attorneys assigned to it and is structured to serve that division's unique needs. Additionally, the Victim/Witness Unit of the office performs services for victims of crime as mandated under the Crime Victims Rights Act.

Strategic Goals

Strategic issues for the Department include:

 Effectively utilize staff and budgets to perform statutorily mandated services. (Efficient Use of Resources)

The Prosecuting Attorney's office is responsible for other legal functions, including:

- Keeping victims notified of case status, their right to participate, and to protect/preserve their rights;
- · Providing information on juvenile offenders to the Kent Intermediate School District; and
- Representing the County in forfeiture actions.

Significant Accomplishments

- Established program with Hispanic Center to send a victim witness advocate to the Hispanic Center, once a month, to provide an open and non-threatening space to meet to discuss issues their clients may be having in the court system. The advocates will have the opportunity to meet with victims of domestic violence who may be afraid to file a report, witnesses who may be afraid to go to the courthouse, or any other person at the Hispanic Center who may have questions regarding anything pertaining to the criminal justice system. This is a program designed to reach a significant minority group in the community who are in fear of getting involved in the criminal justice system given possible immigration implications.
- Set up a Juvenile Teen Sexting program to deal with the issue of peer-to-peer exchange of inappropriate photos. In the past we have had situations in the County where multiple groups of teens or pre-teens exchange photos and we have made the decision not to get involved and let the school districts handle it. This program is a way to take action to educate the kids who are engaging in this sort of behavior by providing a diversion program where they view an online program and participate in a class where the potential dangers of texting and on-line behavior are reviewed. If they successfully complete the program no charges are filed. If they do not complete it, we then may file juvenile charges.
- Convicted more cases per Assistant Prosecuting Attorney (APA) than any other large county in Michigan (Genesee, Ingham, Kalamazoo, Macomb, Oakland, and Wayne) with 94 convictions per APA.
- Based upon Kent County's population, provided services at the second lowest cost per tax payer (\$13.55) than any other large county in Michigan.

Mission

To establish paternity and enter child support orders within federally mandated time lines.

Overview

The Prosecuting Attorney represents the State of Michigan in proceedings to establish paternity and set child support orders. The Prosecuting Attorney is an elected official with a four-year term, chosen at the time of the Presidential election, on the partisan ballot.

The office is divided into the following divisions: Criminal, Appellate, Juvenile, and Family Law. The Criminal, Appellate and Juvenile divisions are under the General Government functional area. Each division has specific attorneys assigned to it and is structured to serve that division's unique needs. Additionally, the Victim/ Witness Unit of the office performs services for victims of crime as mandated under the Crime Victims Rights Act.

Strategic Goals

Strategic issues for the Department include:

 Effectively utilize staff and budgets to perform statutorily mandated services. (Efficient Use of Resources)

Significant Accomplishments

- Completed 98% of cases within 6 months from service date at a rate that is better than is required by federal guidelines.
- Entered support orders in 82% of cases and established paternity in 98% of cases which also is better than required by federal guidelines.
- Began collaboration with Health Department and FOC to start "Early Establishment Program" will result in genetic testing and paternity establishment in as little as 8 weeks after a child is born.

DEPARTMENT: PROSECUTORS OFFICE

Department Mission Statement:

The mission of the Prosecutor's Office is to perform a variety of statutorily mandated services on behalf of the citizens of Kent County. These include appearances in all criminal proceedings involving charges brought on behalf of the People of the State of Michigan in the various County District and Circuit Courts as well as appearances in delinquency, neglect/dependency, mental competency, and adult guardianship proceedings in both the Probate Court and Family Division of the Circuit Court. Additionally, the Appellate Division initiates and responds to appeals resulting from cases in which the Prosecutor's Office has appeared. Further, the Family Law Division, by virtue of both statutory requirements and contractual obligations, is responsible for the establishment of paternity and the levels of child support set in cooperation with the Department of Health and Human Services.
