| <b>By 4:00 p.m., July 21</b>           | Candidates without political party affiliation who seek a partisan office file qualifying petitions and Affidavits of Identity. ( <a href="#">168.590c</a> ) Withdrawal deadline elapses at 4:00 p.m. on July 25.                                   |
| <b>By 4:00 p.m., July 26</b>           | Nonpartisan candidates file nominating petitions and Affidavits of Identity. ( <a href="#">168.644e</a> ) Withdrawal deadline elapses at 4:00 p.m. on July 29.  |
| <b>By July 27</b>                      | City and township clerks forward names and address of candidates to county clerk. ( <a href="#">168.321</a> and <a href="#">168.349</a> )   |
| <b>By 5:00 p.m., August 2</b>          | Petitions to place proposals on ballot filed with county and local clerks. ( <a href="#">168.646a</a> )   |
| <b>By 4:00 p.m., August 16</b>         | Ballot wording of proposals qualified to appear on ballot certified to county and local clerks. ( <a href="#">168.646a</a> )  |
| <b>September 9</b>                     | Final date cities and townships can establish, move, or abolish a polling place prior to the next election. ( <a href="#">168.662</a> )   |
| <b>September 24</b>                    | Delivery of military and overseas AV ballots must begin for the November election by this date. All requests received since November 2, 2021 from a military or overseas voter must be honored for all 2022 elections. ( <a href="#">168.759a</a> ) |
| <b>September 29</b>                    | Absent voter ballots must be available for issuance to voters. ( <a href="#">168.714</a> )  |
| <b>September 29 through October 18</b> | Precinct inspectors appointed for election by Election Commission. ( <a href="#">168.674</a> )  |
| <b>October 11</b>                      | Clerk shall post and notify the Secretary of State of hours the clerk's office will be open on the Saturday or Sunday or both immediately before the election to issue and receive absent voter ballots. ( <a href="#">168.761b</a> )               |
| <b>October 11</b>                      | Clerk shall post and notify the Secretary of State of any additional locations and hours the clerk will be available to issue and receive absent voter ballots, if applicable. ( <a href="#">168.761b</a> )   |

| <b>October 11</b>                              | Notice of voter registration for general election published. One notice required. ( <a href="#">168.498</a> )  |
| <b>October 24</b>                              | Last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk for the November election. ( <a href="#">168.497</a> )  |
| <b>October 25 through 8:00 p.m. November 8</b> | In-person registration with the local clerk with proof of residency. ( <a href="#">168.497</a> )   |
| <b>By 4:00 p.m., October 28</b>                | Write-in candidates file Declaration of Intent forms ( <a href="#">168.737a</a> )  |
| <b>By November 1</b>                           | Notice of election published by this date. One notice required. ( <a href="#">168.653a</a> )   |
| <b>By November 3</b>                           | Public accuracy test must be conducted. (R 168.778) Notice of test must be published at least 48 hours before test. ( <a href="#">168.798</a> )  |
| <b>Up to 5:00 p.m., November 4</b>             | Electors may obtain an absent voter ballot via First Class mail. ( <a href="#">168.759</a> )   |
| <b>Up to 5:00 p.m., November 4</b>             | Electors may submit a written request to spoil their absent voter ballot to receive a new ballot by mail. ( <a href="#">168.765b</a> )   |
| <b>Up to 10:00 a.m., November 7</b>            | Electors who have returned their absent voter ballot may submit a written request in person to spoil their absent voter ballot and receive a new ballot in the clerk's office. ( <a href="#">168.765b</a> )  |
| <b>Up to 4:00 p.m., November 7</b>             | Electors may obtain an absent voter ballot in person in the clerk's office. ( <a href="#">168.761</a> )  |
| <b>Up to 4:00 p.m., November 7</b>             | Electors who have lost their absent voter ballot or not yet received their ballot in the mail may submit a written request in person to spoil their absent voter ballot and receive a new ballot in the clerk's office. ( <a href="#">168.765b</a> ) |
| <b>Up to 4:00 p.m., November 8</b>             | Emergency absentee voting for November general election. ( <a href="#">168.759b</a> )  |
| <b>Up to 8:00 p.m., November 8</b>             | Election Day registrants may obtain and vote an absent voter ballot in person in the clerk's office or vote in person in the proper precinct. ( <a href="#">168.761</a> )  |
